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**Rationale:** The course is intended to facilitate the reading of ancient Latin literature. Students will learn basic Latin vocabulary and the fundamentals of grammar and sentence structure. They will read continuous passages of Latin prose and some poetry. The emphasis will be always on the comprehension of the written language.

Students are expected to attend all class sessions and to have assignments ready on time, not only for their own benefit, but also in order not to slow down the progress of classmates. Attendance and participation will be factored into course grades in borderline cases.
